For one report your child may choose to do an assignment other than a written book report.

- Make a diorama (shoebox) of their favorite part of the story. Bring to share with the class. Be able to talk about your story.
- Make a painting on posterboard of your favorite part of the story. Be able to talk about your story.
- Make a picture poster of the main characters. Draw and label pictures of the main characters. Be able to tell about each character when you present it to the class.
- Write a poem about the story or one of the main characters. Dress up like your character when you present to class.
- Make up a song about your story. Sing for your classmates.
