*Please be advised the summer assignments are mandatory and they will be part of the first quarter Language Arts grade.

Students are required to log on to khanacademy.org or other comparable sites and complete math activities for third grade level. A log-in form is attached for the students to fill out and have been signed by a parent/guardian. Students should log in at least two hours per week during the summer break. We strongly recommend this in order to keep basic math operations fresh in the student's mind.

Left Sleeve: Write your name and the number of stars (out of 5) you would give the book as a book critic.

Back of T-Shirt: Write 10-15 nouns, verbs, and adjectives that describe your book's plot, setting & characters. Make sure to use words that will grab people's attention and make them want to read your book!
