## Protagonist:

This is the person or thing that drives the story. Often referred to as the good guy – this is not always true. You should mention their name, age, personal characteristics (smart, funny, evil ...etc.) and what their role is in the novel or story.

## Antagonist:

This is the person or thing that <u>works against</u> the protagonist. Often referred to as the bad guy – this is not always the case. You should mention their name, age, personal characteristics (smart, clever, sneaky ...etc.) and what their role is in the novel or story.

#### Conflict:

This can be person vs. person, person vs. nature, person vs. life circumstances... etc. You must describe the conflict.

### Setting:

Describe when and where the story takes place. Also, describe the mood or tone of the setting. Is it eerie, pleasant... etc.

#### Plot:

The plot must have three or four major incidents from the story that allows me, the reader, the opportunity to get a good idea of beginning, middle, and end.

#### Climax:

The highest point of interest – revelations are made.

#### Denouement:

. Always comes after the climax and ties all loose ends.

#### Theme:

This is a life lesson we learn from the story or novel.

- Examine two of the main characters and their development (Protagonist & Antagonist)
- Include a statement about one thing you connected to in the reading
- Write a description of the mood
